VETiS ELIGIBILITY

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VETiS FUNDING

Vocational education and training in schools (VETiS) is delivery of nationally recognised qualifications to school students, providing them with the skills and knowledge required for employment in specific industries.

VETiS qualifications can be undertaken in years 10, 11 and 12, and can count towards the Queensland Certificate of Education. All students who are eligible for the VETiS funding will be provided training fee-free.

The following VETiS qualifications advertised in this brochure are funded by the Queensland Government under the VETiS investment budget:

TRAINING INFORMATION

INTAKES

Intakes for our High School Further Education and Training Programs are available throughout the year. The intakes are as follows:

- Currently enrolled in year 10 or 11: Intakes will commence in week 1 of each semester.
- Currently enrolled in year 12: Intakes will commence in week 1 of Semester 1 only.

DURATION

All of our High School Further Education and Training Programs will be delivered over a period of 20 weeks, plus 2 weeks mandatory Vocational Placement (see below for more information on Vocational Placement) of a minimum 60 hours during school holidays.

Our Certificate II in Electrotechnology is the only exception to this, with delivery being conducted over 30 weeks, plus 2 weeks mandatory Vocational Placement (see below for more information on Vocational Placement) of a minimum 60 hours during school holidays.

Days of delivery may occur on any day of the week from Monday – Friday and is subject to negotiation with the school you attend. Classes on the day of delivery, negotiated by your school, will run from 8AM–4 PM. Classes do not run on Public Holidays and may be held on an alternate weekday to ensure student progression.

VOCATIONAL PLACEMENT

Each pre-vocational course in our High School Further Education and Training Program contains a mandatory 60 hours of Vocational Placement, that is to be achieved during school holidays (or on weekends) to successfully complete the course.

We encourage all students participating in our programs to seek placement themselves if possible. All Trades Queensland will assist in solidifying placement for students who cannot achieve this themselves.

As part of the Vocational Placement, students will be required to complete a logbook that will be provided to them upon commencement of the course, logging all relevant activities as well as their time of attendance in the workplace.
